Plan a timetable for the final two months to revise a major subject every day and a few topics from 3-4 other subjects alongside so that you are not panicking in the end for any subject. Exam Preparation can be a challenging task, but with the right approach we can pass with ease. We should complete studying the basics at least a month before the exams. The daily exams and the large amount of

material I had to review before exams were my biggest issues. Since appearing for both groups' means having exams daily, we will have time only to revise the portions. Studying the basics ensure deeper understanding about the subject.

Studying the Textbook given by the institute is more than enough for the exams and Try to focus on the substance of the sections rather than the section numbers, as it is harder to recall. Try answering previous year question papers; it will help you prepare for the exam's scheduling and writing pace.

We should see challenges as stepping stones to success. Exam preparation does not imply that we should ignore our hobbies and self-care. Always make time for your hobbies, no matter how small—reading a comic book or watching a movie. Make sure you consume a balanced diet as being sick during an exam can interfere with your study pattern. Try practicing meditation if experiencing pressure.

In the words of Edmund Hillary, "It is not the mountain we conquer, but ourselves". Success is not final and failure is not fatal, it's just a path towards your goal of becoming a company secretary. No matter how many tries it takes, we have to be persistent and diligent in our efforts to pass the exams. Like Naruto, we should never give up even when faced with daunting challenges.

I was surprised when I found out that I am an AIR Rank Holder.

I have done my CA Intermediate and joined CS alongside my CA Articleship. People demotivated me that I am being overconfident and taking the risk by joining a course which is also at par with CA. I believed that I could do it because there were also students who managed to study both the courses together.

There were CA firms who refused to entertain students doing the other courses. Thankgod..My auditor allowed me to join the course and also gave me 8 days leave including the 3days study holiday during the exams. Here I share the tips that helped me to crack the exams..May be it would be helpful for you.

I didn't go to any classes and did self studies. Just watched some YouTube videos. I knew what is my strength and weakness...Make a SWOT analysis and convert your weakness into strengths.

Subjects like JIGL, ECIPL, CMSL are completely new to me. And JIGL was the most difficult among all the subjects. So I revised it daily.

"Consistency is the key for subjects where you are lacking at"

The same goes for ECIPL, CMSL, Corporate law. Quoting the case laws would be fetching marks. But don't concentrate entirely on case laws alone. Accountancy & Tax - Working out the sums is most important in case of taxation and accountancy. I am good at numbers. So this was not a problem for me.

SBIL was easy. As it deals with different types of business structure. Prepare a flowchart for qns like what are the steps to apply for GST Registration. Question comes only from the ICSI study material only. But it will not be directly tested. For example Case studies are more common in the recent exams.

Complete revision at least 1 Month before the exams..Be confident and give the exams..The rest is taken care of by the almighty.

Securing a rank in the CS Professional Programme exams across all three modules requires diligent planning, focused study, and strategic preparation. Here's a strategy along with some tips to help you achieve your goal, which I have used while preparing for the same . **Strategy:**

1. **Create a Study Schedule:**
