GUIDELINES FOR SEEKING EXTENSION OF REGISTRATION

EXECUTIVE PROGRAMME EXAMINATION

No extension of registration will be allowed to any student if he/she has not passed/completed the Executive Programme (Inter) examination during the validity of registration period. All such students will have to seek registration *de novo* only.

PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMME EXAMINATION

- 1. Students whose registration expires between 28th/29th February and 31st May and between 31st August and 30th November will be allowed extension of time without payment of extension of registration fee for the limited purpose of appearing in the ensuing June or December examination, respectively, as the case may be.
- Registration of a student may be extended beyond a period of five years on year-to-year basis for appearing in the Professional Programme (Final) examination:
 - (i) if he/she has completed postal/oral coaching and has been issued with coaching completion certificate for all modules (groups) of the Professional Programme examination (Final) under new syllabus during the validity of the previous registration period or has passed at least one module (group) of the Professional Programme (Final) examination under the New Syllabus during the validity of the previous registration period as the case may be; and
 - (ii) makes an application for extension of registration period along with requisite fee within six months from the date of expiry of registration or within six weeks of the declaration of results of the last examination in which he/she appeared, whichever is later.
- 3. Extension of registration shall be granted for one year at a time on payment of extension of registration fee of Rs. 500 per annum, arrears of fee, if any, under the previous registration and service charges @ Rs. 150 per module (group) for which the student has not been issued with the coaching completion certificate for the Professional Programme (Final).
- 4. On the student's application for extension of registration being accepted by the Institute, the extended period will be counted in continuation of his previous registration. He/she will also continue to bear the same registration number.
- No candidate will be allowed more than two extensions including the extension, if any, already availed under old/new syllabus for completing Professional Programme (Final) examination under the new syllabus.
- 6. A student who completes the Professional Programme (Final) examination (of the Institute) during the extended period of registration will be required to comply with the practical experience and practical training requirements as stipulated under Company Secretaries Regulations, 1982 and guidelines framed there under in this regard.
- Study material will not again be supplied on seeking extension of registration. However, it can be had on payment of Rs. 160 per subject.
- 8. A student, on being granted extension of registration, shall be eligible to get the 'Student Company Secretary' from the month next to the month in which his application for extension of registration is accepted by the Institute.
- 9. The Secretary on being satisfied that application of any of the guidelines cause undue hardship to a candidate - may relax any of the said guidelines by recording reasons in writing.

GUIDELINES FOR REGISTRATION DE NOVO

(Registration de novo pursuant to regulation 22 read with subregulation (2) of regulation 24.)

- (A) Guidelines for candidates seeking registration de novo within two years of the expiry of previous registration.
 - A person whose registration has been cancelled on expiry of fiveyears period or otherwise may within two years of cancellation of former registration seek registration de novo on payment of the following fees:
 - (i) Registration fee: Rs.1500 (w.e.f. 1.4.2008)
 - (ii) (a) Where a student has not completed coaching for both modules (Group) of Executive Programme (Intermediate) all modules (Group) of Professional Programme (Final), balance of Rs.5,000 of the postal tuition fee if enrolled for Executive Programme (Intermediate) or balance of Rs. 7,500, if enrolled for Professional Programme (Final), as the case may be, after adjusting the amount paid on this

- account earlier. However, credit for having completed coaching in a particular module (Group) may be given if the coaching completion certificate has not been issued due to invalid registration or any other reason.
- (b) Postal tuition fee of Rs 5,000 in the case of students who have passed the Executive Programme (Intermediate) examination but not enrolled for the Professional Programme (Final).
- (c) Arrears of postal tuition fee, if due, under former registration where the students have been issued with coaching completion certificate(s) for both modules (Group) of Executive Programme (Intermediate) all modules (Group) of Professional Programme (Final) as the case may be.
- 2. On the student being registered do novo he will be given credit for the oral or postal tuition completed during the validity of his previous registration in the corresponding paper(s) of the new syllabus. Such a student shall not be supplied with the study material afresh. Study material can however be obtained on payment of Rs. 160 per subject. Student Company Secretary will be sent free of cost during the validity period of registration de novo from the month subsequent to the month in which the student was registered de novo.
- (B) Guidelines for candidates seeking registration de novo after two years of the expiry of previous registration.
 - A person whose registration has been cancelled or has terminated on expiry of five-year period and has not sought registration de novo within two years of the expiry of former registration may seek registration de novo within 5 years of the cancellation/termination of his former registration on payment of the following fees:

(i) Registration fee Rs. 1500

(ii) Exemption fee for

(a) Foundation Programme
 (b) Executive Programme (Inter)
 Rs. 500
 Examination (if already

passed)

iii) Paperwise exemption fee

(a) Executive Programme (Inter) Rs. 100 per paper (b) Professional Programme (Final) Rs. 100 per paper

(iv) Where a student has not completed coaching for both modules (Groups) of Executive Programme (Inter) all modules of Professional Programme (Final), balance of Rs. 5,000 of the postal tuition fee, if enrolled for Executive Programme (Inter) or balance of Rs. 7,500 if enrolled for Professional Programme (Final), as the case may be. However, credit for having completed the coaching in a particular module may be given if the coaching completion certificate has not been

- issued due to invalid registration or any other reason.

 (v) Rs. **7,500** in the case of students who have passed the Executive Programme (Inter) but not enrolled for the Professional Programme (Final).
- (vi) Arrears of postal tuition fee, if due, under former registration where the students have been issued with coaching completion certificates for both modules (Group) of Executive Programme (Inter) all modules (Group) of Professional Programme (Final).
- 2. On the student being registered de novo, he will be given credit for the oral or postal tuition completed during the validity of his previous registration in the corresponding paper(s) at the new syllabus. Such a student shall not be supplied with the study material afresh. Study material can however be obtained on payment @ Rs. 160 per subject. Student Company Secretary will be sent free of cost during the validity period of registration de novo from the month subsequent to the month in which the student was registered de novo.
- The registration de novo will be valid for a period of five years from the month in which the student has been registered de novo.
- (C) No candidate shall be registered as a student de novo if he applies after five years of the expiry of the former registration. He may seek fresh registration as a student and no credit for the fees paid or examination passed under the former registration will be admissible on his registration as a fresh student under any circumstances.

ACADEMIC GUIDANCE

GENERAL AND COMMERCIAL LAWS WRIT OF MANDAMUS¹

The literal meaning of the word 'mandamus' is to command. Mandamus is a judicial remedy in the form of a command/ order from the Supreme Court or a High Court to any constitutional, statutory or a non-statutory agency- to do or to forbear from doing some specific act which that agency is obliged to do or refrain from doing under the law and which is in the nature of a public duty or a statutory duty.

English writers trace the development of the writ from the Norman Conquest; however it was only in the early part of the eighteen century that the writ came to be frequently used in the public law to compel the performance of the public duties. In Halsbury's Laws of England, writ of mandamus has been defined as follows: The writ of mandamus is a writ of most extensive remedial nature and is, in form, a command issuing from the High Court of Justice directed to any person, corporation, or inferior tribunal, requiring him or them to do some particular thing therein specified which appertains to his or their office and is in the nature of a public duty. Its purpose is to remedy defects of justice; and accordingly it will issue to the end that justice may be done, in all cases where there is a specific legal right and no specific legal remedy for enforcing that right; and it may issue in cases where, although there is an alternative remedy, yet that mode of redress is less convenient beneficial and effectual.

The following conditions must exist in order to grant the writ of mandamus:

There must be performance of public duties. A public duty is one which is created either by a statute, the Constitution or by some rule of common law. Mention should be made that a duty private in nature and arising out of a contract was not enforceable through this writ. It was in the case of Gujarat State Financial Corporation v. Lotus Hotel, the Supreme Court issued a writ of mandamus for the specific performance of a contract to advance money. However, mandamus does not lie where the duty is ministerial in nature. A ministerial duty is one where the authority has to act on the instructions of his superior. Likewise, mandamus cannot be issued to enforce administrative directions which do not have the force of law. Hence it is discretionary with the authority to accept it or to reject it. But if the administrative instructions are binding, mandamus would lie to enforce it.

The Supreme Court in *Shiv Shankar Dal Mills* v. *State of Haryana*, AIR 1969 SC 1306 has held that the expression 'public duty' does not imply that the person or body whose duty it is must be a public official or an official body. Therefore, mandamus would lie against a company constituted under a statute for the purpose of compelling it to fulfill its public responsibilities.

There must be a specific demand and refusal: Before mandamus can be granted, there must be a specific demand for the fulfillment of duty and there must be specific refusal by the authority. Express demand and refusal is not necessary. In fact it can be inferred from the circumstances of the case.

There must be a clear right to enforce the duty: Mandamus can not be issued unless there is in the applicant a right to compel the performance of some duty cast on the authority. The right to enforce a duty must subsist till the date of the petition. If the right has been lawfully terminated before filing the petition mandamus can not be issued.

Before a mandamus is issued to compel the authorities to do something, it must be shown that there is a statute which imposes a legal duty and the aggrieved party has the legal right under the statute to enforce its performance No mandamus will lie where the duty sought to be enforced is of a discretionary nature nor will it lie to compel performance of an act contrary to law.

Grounds:

Mandamus can be issued on all those grounds on which certiorari and prohibition can be issued. Therefore, mandamus can be issued for lack of jurisdiction, excess of jurisdiction, abuse of jurisdiction, for violation of principles of natural justice and an error of law apparent on the face of record. Mandamus may be issued not only to compel the authority to do something but also to restrain it from doing something. Therefore, it is both negative and positive and hence can do the work of all other writs. Recently the Madras High Court has held that a writ of mandamus for listing of shares cannot be issued in a matter like the listing of shares as it involves complicated questions of fact which is the exclusive jurisdiction of the concerned authorities. (viz; SEBI, SAT). The High Court cannot decide such issues as it does not have the expertise. [Eonour Tecnologies Ltd.v. Madhya Pradesh Stock Exchange (2005)124 Comp cas,122].

Under the Constitution of India, such power of writ jurisdiction is vested with the Supreme Court under Article 32 and with the High Courts under Article 226. The writ of mandamus would not lie against the President of India, Governor of a State, private individual or private body except where the State is in collusion with such private party in the matter of contravention of any provision of the Constitution of a statute. In view of the provisions of the Article 122(2) and 212 (2) of the Constitution, mandamus will not also lie against any officer or member of Parliament or State legislature in whom powers are vested for regulating procedure or the conduct of the business of for maintaining orders.

It is a discretionary remedy and the High Court may refuse to issue writ of mandamus if alternative remedy exists except in case of infringement of a fundamental right.

It is a discretionary remedy and the High Court may refuse to issue writ of mandamus if alternative remedy exists except in case of infringement of a fundamental right. While hearing the petition for mandamus, the court does not sit as a court of appeal. The court will not examine the correctness or otherwise of the decision on merits. It cannot substitute its own wisdom for the discretion vested in the authority unless the exercise of discretion is illegal. This is true for other writs also.

COMPANY LAW/COMPANY SECRETARIAL PRACTICE STUDY UPDATES²

Companies (Appointment and Qualifications of Secretary)
Amendment Rules, 2009: The Central Government has amended
Rule 2 of Companies (Appointment and Qualifications of Secretary)
Rules, 1988 [vide MCA Notification No. G.S.R. 11 (E) (05-Jan-09)]

- In rule 2, the words Rupees two crores [used in sub-rule (1) and in proviso to sub-rule (4)] are substituted by Rs. 5 Crores. In accordance with revised sub-rule (1) of Companies (Appointment and Qualifications of Secretary) Rules, 1988, every company having a paid up share capital of Rs. 5 Crores (as against Rs. 2 Crores) shall have a whole time company secretary.
- In sub-rule (3), second and third proviso is omitted. Second proviso provided that where a company with its registered office and corporate office and works situated in towns with a population of less than one lakh and having a paid-up share capital of rupees two crore or more but less than rupees five crore may appoint an individual, who possesses the specified qualifications, as a company secretary. Further, third proviso provided that if the company as mentioned in second proviso as above shifts either its registered office or corporate office

or works from towns with a population of less than one lakh, it shall appoint a whole time secretary.

After sub-rule 3, **sub-rule 3A** is inserted. In accordance with newly inserted sub-rule (3A), a company having a paid up share capital of two crore rupees or more but less than five crore rupees **may** appoint any individual who possesses the qualification of membership of the Institute of Company Secretaries Act, 1980 (56 of 1980), as a whole-time secretary to perform the duties of a secretary under the Companies Act, 1956. Further, if in such a case, a company has appointed a whole-time secretary, possessing the qualifications of membership of the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, such a company is not required to obtain a certificate from a secretary in whole-time practice under rule 3 of the Companies (Complaince Certificate) Rules, 2001.

SECURITIES LAWS & COMPLIANCES

Amendments to SEBI (Disclosure and Investor Protection) Guidelines, 2000³

SEBI has amended the SEBI (Disclosure and Investor Protection) Guidelines, 2000 on February 24, 2009. The salient features of the amendments are given in brief as under:

(i) Validity period of observations

- The validity period of the observations issued by SEBI has been enhanced from the existing period of three months to twelve months.
- b) Before opening of the issue, every issuer shall be required to file an updated offer document with SEBI, highlighting all changes made in the document.
- c) Where updation include significant changes in the offer document, such an updated Red herring prospectus/ prospectus or letter of offer shall be filed with SEBI at least one month before filing the same with Registrar of Companies or with Designated Stock Exchange as the case may be. SEBI would specify the procedure for submitting such updated documents including what will constitute "significant changes", "additional fees" separately.

(ii) Timelines for bonus issues

At present, in terms of the SEBI (DIP) Guidelines, a listed company is required to complete a bonus issue within a maximum period of six months from the date of approval of the issue by the board of directors of the company. The amendment reduces the timeline for completion of bonus issues. Accordingly, where no shareholders' approval is required as per the Articles of Association of the issuer, the bonus issue shall be completed within fifteen days from the date of the approval by the board of directors of the issuer in this regard. However, where shareholders' approval is required for capitalization of profits or reserves as per the Articles of Association of the issuer, the bonus issue shall be completed within 2 months from the date of the meeting of board of directors where-in bonus was announced subject to shareholders' approval.

(iii) Price Band

At present, the floor price or price band in an initial public offer through the book building process is required to be disclosed in the Red Herring Prospectus registered with the Registrar of Companies, before the issue opening date. The amended DIP Guidelines permit the issuer making an initial public offer to announce the floor price or price band after the date of registration of the Red Herring Prospectus with the Registrar of Companies, atleast two working days before the issue opening date.

Further, where the floor price or price band is announced after the date of registration of the Red Herring Prospectus with the Registrar of Companies, every issuer making a public issue, whether initial public offer or further public offer, shall ensure wide dissemination of the floor price or price band through various means, including newspaper advertisement. While announcing the floor price or price band, the issuer shall also disclose details of the relevant financial ratios used for justification of the floor price or price band. In case of a price band, such financial ratios shall be calculated for both upper and lower end of the price band.

(iv) Preferential Allotment

- At present, the SEBI (DIP) Guidelines provide that warrants can be allotted on preferential basis, subject to the allottees paying upfront, an amount equivalent to at least 10% of the price fixed, at the time of allotment of warrants. It has now been decided to enhance the upfront amount payable from 10% to 25%.
- Certain clarifications regarding lock-in requirements of instruments allotted on preferential basis have also been made.
- c) It has been decided that an issuer, which has been granted relaxation by the Board in terms of regulation 29A of the SEBI (Substantial Acquisitions of Shares and Takeovers) Regulations, 1997, shall be exempted from certain provisions of Chapter XIII of DIP Guidelines, subject to the condition that in the explanatory statement to the notice for the general meeting of the shareholders, the issuer gives adequate disclosures about the details of the plan including the process proposed to be followed by it for identification of the allottees in addition to the disclosures required in other applicable laws.

(v) Policy on relaxation from strict enforcement of rule 19(2)(b) of the SCR Rules, 1957

At present, the SEBI (DIP) Guidelines provides for the policy regarding considering the requests for relaxation of the strict enforcement of requirements of rule 19(2)(b) of the SCRR where an unlisted company intends to list its shares issued to the shareholders of a listed company pursuant to a scheme of arrangement approved by a High Court, without making an initial public offer.

The DIP Guidelines have now been amended to provide for the policy for considering relaxation from strict enforcement of requirements of rule 19(2)(b) of SCRR in case of proposal for listing of following securities by a listed issuer:-

- Equity shares with differential rights as to dividend, voting or otherwise, offered through rights or bonus issue.
- (ii) Warrants issued along with Non Convertible Debentures through Qualified Institutions Placement.

II. Mandatory disclosures of details of shares pledged by the promoters

To enhance the disclosure requirements, SEBI has made it mandatory on the part of promoters (including promoter group) to disclose the details of pledge of shares held by them in listed entities promoted by them. Such disclosures shall be made as and when the shares are pledged i.e. event based disclosure as well as by way of periodic disclosures.

Details of pledge of shares and release/ sale of "pledged shares" shall be made to the company and the company shall in turn inform the same to the public through the Stock Exchanges.

III. Prevention of Money Laundering

The stock exchanges have advised their members that in addition to appointment of a Principal Officer, drawing up written procedures to implement PMLA provisions, KYC policy encompassing Customer

Acceptance/Client Identification Program and Risk Categorization various other procedures/ systems should be in place which include:

- Monitoring of transactions and generation of alerts for identification of suspicious transactions.
- 2. Analysis of such alerts generated.
- Use of complete KYC information including details of occupation and financial status at the time of analyzing alerts.
- Reporting of appropriate cases to Financial Intelligence Unit India (FIU-IND).

IV. Review of External Commercial Borrowings (ECB) policy

ECB policy has been reviewed to keep it in tune with the evolving macroeconomic situation, changing market conditions, sectoral requirements, the external sector and lessons of experience. Various aspects of ECB policy such as USD 500 million limit per company per year under the Automatic Route, eligible borrower, recognised lender, end-use, average maturity period, prepayment, refinancing of existing ECB and reporting arrangements remain unchanged. The following aspects of the policy have been modified:

(i) All-in-cost ceilings on ECB

Till date all-in-cost ceilings for ECBs, in respect of both automatic as well as approval routes, for average maturity period of 3-5 years and more than 5 years are 6 month Libor+300 bps and 6 month Libor+500 bps respectively. The requirement of all-in-cost ceilings on ECB has been dispensed with until June 30, 2009. Eligible borrowers proposing to avail of ECB beyond the permissible all-in-cost ceilings may approach the Reserve Bank of India under the approval route.

(ii) Development of integrated township

In May 2007, RBI had withdrawn the exemption accorded to the 'development of integrated township' as a permissible end-use of ECB. It has now been decided to permit corporates engaged in the development of integrated township to avail of ECB under the Approval Route.

(iii) NBFCs exclusively engaged in financing of the infrastructure sector

At present NBFCs are permitted to avail of ECB for a minimum maturity period of five years to finance import of infrastructure equipments for leasing to infrastructure projects in India. It has now been decided to allow NBFCs, which are exclusively involved in financing of the infrastructure sector, to avail of ECBs from multilateral/regional financial institutions and government owned development financial institutions under the approval route. While considering the applications, RBI will take into account the aggregate commitment of these lenders directly to infrastructure projects in India. The direct lending portfolio of the above lenders vis-a-vis their total ECB lending to NBFCs, at any point of time should not be less than 3:1.

(iv) Services sector

At present entities in the services sector namely Hotels, Hospitals and Software sector are allowed to avail of ECB up to USD 100 million per financial year for import of capital goods under the approval route. It has now been decided to permit the corporates in the Hotels, Hospitals and Software sectors to avail ECB up to USD 100 million per year for both foreign currency and / or Rupee capital expenditure for permissible end use, other than for land acquisition, under the Automatic Route.

(v) Limit for FIIs' investment in corporate debt

FIIs have been permitted to invest up to USD 15 billion in corporate debt as against the current limit of USD 6 billion.

CORPORATE RESTRUCTURING AND INSOLVENCY

FINAL COURSE/PROFESSIONAL PROGRAMME

Corporate Restructuring Strategies - Hiving off⁴

One of the purposes of corporate restructuring is to have an optimum business portfolio, by deciding whether to retain, divest or diversify the business. Business portfolio restructuring can be done in a variety of ways like amalgamation, merger, demerger, slump sale, takeover, disinvestment, joint venture, foreign franchises, strategic alliances, hiving off, etc.

The ultimate choice of strategy by the organization would depend upon its growth objectives, attitude towards risk, the present nature of business and technology in use, resources at its command, its own internal strengths and weaknesses, Government policy, etc.

Presently, many organizations are resorting to hiving off. Hiving off has the inherent merit of lighten up the company, meaning thereby reducing the complexities of the company. Many companies resort to this type of strategy so that they can concentrate on their core business.

Meaning - hiving off

According to World Web Online, the term 'hiving off' means to remove from a group and separate. For example – a unit is hived off from its parent company, meaning thereby, the unit is separated from its parent company.

Advantages of hiving off

Some of the advantages of hiving off are as below:

- Faster growth The division of the unit from its company would help the group to grow faster as it can concentrate on its core business and consequently more value addition can be given to the hived off unit.
- Better utilization of resources After the hiving off, the line of authority becomes clear as the decision making is more focused. This enables better utilization of material and human resources.
- Upgradation of skills and technology Hiving off also helps to upgrade the management skills and technology of the parent company as well as the hived off company.
- Beneficial for the whole company the hiving off sometimes prove beneficial to both the parent and the separated company as they can concentrate on their respective businesses.

We can take the example of pharma industry. As the industry is becomes more and more competitive, Indian pharmaceutical companies are aggressively planning strategies to de-risk their business and are resorting to hiving off their R & D units. This is meant to reduce risk in the core generics business and to focus on improved and innovative investment in R & D, serving the dual purpose of achieving faster growth in the new chemical entity (NCE) business and value addition in the core generics business.

Legal Aspects of hiving off:

- Memorandum of Association of the transferor company should have a provision to sell or dispose off the whole or part of the undertaking.
- The object clause of Transferee Company should provide for the object of carrying out the business which it is acquiring through hiving off.

Some recent examples of hiving off

Recently, Mahindra & Mahindra (M&M) has hived off two of its defence businesses in a move expected to attract more foreign

investments. The company has transfered Land Systems business and Naval Systems business of Mahindra Defence Systems Division to separate corporate bodies or companies.

Moser Baer, India's largest maker of optical disks has spun off its entertainment business into a new company valued at Rs 250 crore.

Apollo Hospitals has also decided to hive off its pharma retailing into a separate company.

Difference between Demerger and hiving off

There is a general mis-conception that demerger and hiving off have the same meaning. However, there are some minor differences between the two terms which are discussed as below:

- In Hiving-off, the payment is made by way of a lump sum consideration in case of transfer of an undertaking.
 - In demerger, the resulting Company (the company which is acquiring the demerged company) issues, in consideration of the demerger, its shares to the shareholder of the demerged Company on a proportionate basis.
- In Hiving off, values are not assigned to individual assets and liabilities of the company.
 - In case of demerger, the assets and liabilities of the demerged Company are transferred at the value appearing at the books of accounts immediately before the demerger to the resulting Company.
- In Hiving- off, unabsorbed depreciation/loss can be carried forward only by a transferor Company (demerged company).
 - In the case of demerger, the resulting Company (acquirer company) avails the benefit of such depreciation/loss.
- In a hiving off, to determine the actual cost of assets transferred, the lump sum consideration received is apportioned in fair and reasonable manner among the assets.

In the case of demerger, the assets are valued at the book value as appearing in the books of transferor.

CORPORATE LAWS

LW(S) 13.03.2009

K.R.SUBRAMANIAN v. OFFICIAL LIQUIDATOR, HIGH COURT OF KERALA [(2009) 147 Comp Cas 213(Ker)], J.B.Koshy & K.P.Balachandran JJ. [Decided on 15.10.2008]

Companies Act, 1956 - Section 454 - Statement of affairs - Failure to file - Liability of managing director - Liability of erstwhile director - managing director showed reasonable cause - OL did not obtain the orders from the Court to direct the erstwhile directors to file statement of affairs - Company court convicted the MD and erstwhile directors - Whether correct - Held, No.

Brief Facts: Upon failure of the company to file the statement of affairs within the stipulated time, complaints were filed against the erstwhile managing director and some erstwhile directors of the company in liquidation. The official liquidator contended that even though some of the accused were not directors at the time of winding up, they could be issued notice and that the board resolution showed that after they resigned from the company they had not handed over the documents, and therefore notice issued to them was in order. The notices issued to the directors were held valid and the erstwhile managing director and the erstwhile directors were convicted and sentenced. They appealed to the High Court.

Decision: Appealed allowed.

Reasons: The official liquidator can demand a statement of affairs from the officers or erstwhile officers of the company in liquidation as mentioned in clauses (a) to (d) of section 454(2) of the Companies Act, 1956, only by getting orders from the court. By mere non-filing of statement of affairs as required, it cannot be deemed that it was not filed without any reasonable excuse.

The appellants had ceased to be directors about three years before the relevant date and therefore they could not be directed to file the statement of affairs without directions from the court. Notices issued to the erstwhile directors were illegal and their conviction and sentence on the basis of the notices were liable to be set aside.

The official liquidator could demand filing of the statement of affairs from the appellant who was the managing director on the relevant date. However, mere default in filing could not attract automatic punishment. In order to cast liability on the erstwhile directors, the official liquidator had adduced evidence to show that they had not handed over any document to the appellant, the managing director. The managing director had adduced evidence to show that immediately on receipt of notice he had apprised the official liquidator that he did not have any documents and was unable to file the statement of affairs. The official liquidator failed to show that the appellant-managing director did not file the statement of affairs for a reasonable cause. The appellant was entitled to be acquitted and his conviction and sentence were to be set aside.

[However the Court clarified that the acquittals were not a bar in the proceedings of winding up and that the official liquidator was free to take action for misfeasance or malfeasance of any other law.]

LW(S) 14.03.2009

YEHUDA SILBERBERG LTD. v. PREMIER POLYWEAVES P. LTD. [(2009) 147 Comp Cas 360 (Mad)], Mrs.Chitra Venkataraman J. [Decided on 27.08.2008]

Section 433 of the Companies Act, 1956 read with section 13(c) of the CPC - Winding up - Petitioner obtained decree against respondent from Israel court - Winding up petition filed on the basis of this foreign decree - Company was a going concern - Bonafide disputes as to the enforceability of the decree were raised - whether the petition should be admitted - Held, No.

Brief Facts: The petitioner sought winding up of the respondent-company on the basis of a decree obtained from a court in Israel and upon failure of the respondent to satisfy the decree. The respondent countered the claim of the petitioner and *inter alia*, submitted that under sections 13(c) and 44A of the Civil Procedure Code, 1908, Israel was not a reciprocal State and a decree of a court in Israel did not have the binding effect of a foreign decree and therefore was not a "debt".

Decision: Petition dismissed.

Reason: Even assuming for a moment that the decision of the court in Israel created a decreetal debt as held in the decision of the Apex court in *Madhusudan Gordhandas and Co v. Madhu Woollen Industries P. Ltd* (1972) 42 Comp Cas 125, the jurisdiction of this court may still refuse to order winding up so long as the articles of association still has relevance to have the company a going company. Hence, on the strength of the very law declared by the Apex court, I do not find any justification to order winding up in this matter.

There are other reasons to reject this petition, namely, bona fides of the defence. As rightly pointed out, serious disputes are raised as regards the binding nature of the decision of the court in Israel by placing reliance on sections 13(c) and 44A of the Code of Civil Procedure. A reading of section 13(c) of the Code of Civil Procedure shows that the foreign judgment shall be conclusive except as regards the instances referred to under section 13(a) to (f). Learned senior counsel for the respondent pointed out that where a decision rested on an incorrect view of the international law or a refusal to recognize the law of India in cases in which such law is applicable, there is no conclusiveness attached to the foreign judgment. Learned senior counsel for the respondent pointed out that the petitioner had not filed any suit within three years as provided for under article 101 of the Limitation Act, 1963. Referring to sections 73 and 74 of the Indian Contract Act, 1872, learned senior counsel pointed out that in the absence of specific material to quantify the damage and loss suffered, the judgment under that head is not maintainable. In the face of the provisions of the Indian Contract Act, the theory of closest and most real connection would have relevance for the purposes of deciding the issue. When the respondent is entitled to have a defence placed under section 73 of the Indian Contract Act, 1872 the reasoning of the court in Israel is open for challenge. In this regard, the claim made by the respondent on the strength of sections 13 (c) and 44A is a substantial defence taken by the respondent. Admittedly, Israel is not one of those reciprocating States recognized in terms of section 44A of the Civil Procedure Code.

Considering the defence made, which cannot be rejected as lacking in *bona fides*, the criteria for ordering winding up not thus satisfied, I do not find any justification in ordering winding up of the respondent-company.

LW(S) 15.03.2009

TAMILNADU ELECTRICITY BOARD v. RASIPURAM TEXTILE P. LTD. [(2009) 147 Comp Cas 315 (SC)], S.B.Sinha & Cryiac Joseph JJ. [Decided on 25.11.2009]

Indian Electricity Act, 1910 - Sections 39(1) and 44(1)(c) - Theft of electricity - Liability of directors - no averments in the complaint that the directors were in charge of and responsible to the affairs of the company - No proof produced - Whether complaint maintainable - Held, No.

Brief Facts: Criminal prosecution was lodged against the respondent company, its managing director and other directors for theft of electrical energy under sections 39(1) and 44(1) (c) of the Indian Electricity Act, 1910. The trial judge convicted the accused holding that all the persons responsible for the administration of a company were liable for the offence committed by the company and that the onus was upon the person who disowned the liability to prove it. On appeal, the Additional District and Sessions Judge set aside the conviction holding that the prosecution had not alleged that the directors were in charge of and were responsible to the mill for the conduct of

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the business of the mill and the records of investigation also did not show that the accused were the directors of the company and which would not be sufficient to fasten criminal liability on them. The High Court affirmed this. The appellant appealed to the Supreme Court.

Decision: Appeal dismissed.

Reasons: In terms of section 49A of the Indian Electricity Act, 1910, it was obligatory on the part of the complainant not only to make requisite averments in the complaint petition but also to prove that any of the directors who was being prosecuted for alleged commission of the offence was in charge of and was otherwise responsible for the conduct of the affairs of the company. Only in the event such an averment was made and sufficient and cogent evidence was brought on record to prove the allegations, would the proviso appended to section 49A be attracted; meaning thereby only in the event it is proved that a director or a group of directors of the company were in charge of and/or were responsible for the conduct of the business of the company, would the burden shift on the accused to establish the ingredients contained in the proviso appended to section 49A of the Act. In the absence of any averment made in the complaint petition as also in the absence of any evidence brought on record by the complainant to satisfy the requirements of section 49A of the Act, the respondents could not have been convicted.

LW(S) 16.03.2009

VIJAY INDUSTRIES v. NATL TECHNOLOGIES LTD [JT 2009 (2) SC 41] S.B.Sinha & Cyriac Joseph, JJ. [Decided on 17.12.2008]

Companies Act, 1956 - Section 433 - Winding up petition - Debt due - Whether the entire debt due must be certain - Held, No.

Brief Facts: Transactions took place between the appellant and the respondent and bills were raised. Payments made were first adjusted against the interest and then balance towards the principal amount. Company failed to pay the final demand and a winding up petition was filed. Certainty as to the debt due was raised. The main question involved was whether for the purposes of winding up petition the entire debt has to be certain.

Decision: Appeal dismissed.

Reasons: In a meeting held on 25.11.2003, promises were made to square up the old outstanding dues and bring it into the system for the purpose of rotation. The agreement spoke of payment of compensation to the appellant for the delay in payment on account of earlier supplies after clearing the entire old dues. There cannot be any doubt whatsoever that when, in principle, the respondent had agreed to compensate the appellant for the delay in payment, the same must be by way of interest payable on the principal amount or otherwise.

Respondent never denied the demand of interest as such, but in its reply dated 30.12.2003 merely stated that a sum of Rs.16, 80,468(sic for Rs.15, 18,460) was due. Section 433 of the Companies Act does not state that the debt must be precisely a definite sum. It has not been disputed before us that failure to pay agreed interest or the statutory interest would come within the purview of the word 'debt.'

On the date of filing of the application, dues in respect of at least a part of the debt which was more than the amount specified in Section 433 of the Companies Act was not denied. It is not a requirement of the law that the entire debt must be definite and certain. The findings of the High Court, with respect, are not correct for more than one reason; firstly, because the Division Bench did not hold that the invoices were not proved by cogent evidence; secondly, question of leading evidence; secondly, question of leading evidence would arise only after the company petition is admitted and, thirdly, issuance of invoices and signature of the respondent thereon is not disputed.

GENERAL LAWS

LW(S) 17.03.2009

M.ABDUL HAQUE & ORS.v. BIRLA YAMAHA LIMITED [156(2009) DLT 460], Kailash Gambhir, J. [Decided on 3.11.2008]

Negotiable Instruments Act, 1881 - Section 142 - Cheque

dishonour - Liability of partners - Partner issued cheque from his personal account - whether liable for the offence - Held, No.

Brief Facts: The petitioner had issued cheque from his personal account against the liability of the firm towards the respondent. The said cheque was dishonoured and the Responded prosecuted the firm and the partners. The trial court took cognizance of the offence. The petitioner moved the High Court seeking quashing of the summons on the ground that he had not issued the cheque from the firms account.

Decision: Petition allowed.

Reasons: The mandate of the section clearly indicates that the firm is liable for prosecution when a cheque is issued on its behalf and bounced on presentation of such cheque. The intendment of the section is not to give scope to individuals to escape by issuing cheques in the name of the firm. Therefore, when cheques are issued in the name of the company, the company is invariably liable for prosecution for the offence under Section 138 of the Act. Thus, when the drawer of the cheque who falls within the ambit of Section 138 of the Act is a human being or a body corporate or even firm, prosecution proceedings can be initiated against such drawer. It is settled law that drawer of the cheque can be prosecuted under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act on the cheque dishonored.

In the instant case, the situation is little different. In the case at hand, the cheque has been issued from the personal account and in the personal capacity by one of the partners of the partnership firm, Mr.P.Mohanakrishnan. Where the Cheques in question are issued by a person in his individual capacity and not as partner of any firm, 'the firm is not an accused in this case anymore, and the remaining partners other than the said person cannot be summoned to stand trial as persons responsible to the firm for conduct of its business. Unlike in the case of a cheque drawn by a person in his individual capacity, in the case of cheque drawn by a person in charge of and responsible to the firm, criminal liability is fastened not only as the defacto drawer of the cheque but also on the firm as well as any partner, manager, secretary or other officer of the firm, provided that such person is guilty of act or omission referred to in Section 141(2) of the Act. What then emerges is that in a case where the offence is committed by a firm, the criminal liability is not confied to the signatory of the cheque alone but also to non-signatories also provided the other conditions in this regard are satisfied. In other words, in a case of this nature it may not be permissible to draw a distinction between signatories and nonsignatories qua the cheque in question.

LW(S) 18.03.2009

AVINASH KUMAR CHAUHAN v. VIJAY KRISHNA MISHRA [JT 2009 (1) SC 656], S.B.Sinha & Cyriac Joseph, JJ. [Decided on 17.12.2008]

Indian Stamp Act,1899 - Sections 33 and 35 - Sale of land - Agreement not stamped - suit filed for recovery relying on the agreement - Trial court dismissed the suit refusing to consider the agreement as evidence - High Court agreed with the Trial Court - Whether correct - Held, Yes.

Brief Facts: The appellant purchased a land under an agreement and consideration was paid. Respondent did not convey the land to the appellant and the appellant sued him for the recovery of the consideration paid by him, relying on the agreement. The agreement was not stamped and registered. The trial court dismissed the suit and the High Court confirmed the ruling. Against the judgment of the High Court the appellant appealed to the Supreme Court contending that the agreement could be relied for collateral purposes.

Decision: Appeal dismissed.

Reasons: Section 33 casts a duty upon every person who has authority to receive evidence and every person in charge of a public office before whom the instrument is produced, if it appears to him that the same is not duly stamped, to impound the same.

The Parliament has, in Section 35 of the Act, advisedly used the word "for any purpose whatsoever". The purpose for which a document

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is sought to be admitted in evidence or the extent thereof would not be a relevant factor for not invoking Sections 35 and 38.

Although ordinarily an agreement to sell would not be subject to payment of stamp duty which is payable on a sale deed, but having regard to the purpose and object it seeks to achieve the legislature thought it necessary to levy stamp duty on an instrument whereby possession has been transferred. The unregistered deed of sale was an instrument which required payment of the stamp duty applicable to a deed of conveyance. Adequate stamp duty admittedly was not paid. The court, therefore, was empowered to pass an order in terms of Section 35 of the Act.

The contention of learned counsel for the appellant that the document was admissible for collateral purpose, in our opinion, is not correct. Section 35 of the Act, categorically provided that a document of this nature shall not be admitted for any purpose whatsoever. If all purposes for which the document is sought to be brought in evidence are excluded, the document would not be admissible for collateral purposes.

CONSUMER PROTECTION

LW(S) 19.03.2009

COX AND KINGS (I) LTD.v. RAJ KUMAR MITTAL & ANR.[156 (2009) DLT 467], Shiv Narayan Dhingra, J. [Decided on 10.12.2008]

Consumer Protection Act, 1986 read with Article 227 of the Constitution of India - Consumer complaint filed against the petitioner - District forum awarded compensation - Appeal to the State Commission dismissed - Petitioner moved the High court under writ - Whether maintainable - Held, No.

Brief Facts: The petitioner is a company carrying on business of arranging travels and tours within India as well as abroad. The respondents had booked tours with the petitioners. Finding that the petitioner committed multifarious deficiencies due to which their pleasure trip had turned into a misery trip, they made complaints before the District Forum. The District Forum after considering the entire facts and material awarded compensation to each of the respondents for causing harassment to the respondents on account of deficiency of service, plus cost of litigation. Aggrieved by the order of District Forum, the petitioner preferred appeals before the State Commission who dismissed the same *in limini* and passed the impugned orders. Hence these petitions.

Decision: Petition dismissed.

Reasons: It is apparent that the Consumer Protection Act has provided an inbuilt mechanism for redressal of grievance of the parties at three levels; one at the consumer Forum, second at State Commission level and the third at National Commission level. The National Commission has been given powers to call for the records of the State Commission and if it comes to a conclusion that the State Commission has failed to exercise jurisdiction so vested in it or has acted in excess of its jurisdiction, or has acted with material irregularity, the same can be rectified by the National Commission. The powers vested in the National Commission are rather vast in nature than the powers to be exercised by this Court under Article 227 of the Constitution of India. I consider that when an alternate remedy is available to the petitioner, the petitioner's approaching this Court under Article 227 of the Constitution of India is not justified.

There is no doubt that this Court has supervisory jurisdiction over all Tribunals subordinate to it but it must be kept in mind that these supervisory powers should not be exercised in a manner so as to render the legislative measures as infructuous. The Legislature had intended that the disputes regarding consumers must be settled by separate Forum of Tribunals and a three-tier consumer redressal mechanism has been provided by the Legislature in the form of District Forum, State Commission and National Commission under the Act to see that the principles of natural justice are followed in its true spirit and nobody goes unheard and the Tribunals subordinate to National Commission act within their jurisdiction. Once a specialized body and

Tribunals have been provided, it is not fit for the High Court to assume jurisdiction even where an alternative remedy is provided by the Legislature and burden itself with the work of other Tribunals as well. The whole purpose of creation of Tribunals stand defeated if the High Court usurps jurisdiction of other Tribunals while exercising powers under Article 227.In view of the above discussion, these petitions deserve dismissal and are hereby dismissed as such.

ATTENTION STUDENTS!

GRANT OF TOTAL EXEMPTION IN UNDERGOING COMPULSORY COMPUTER TRAINING PROGRAM TO PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

The Institute has decided to grant total exemption in undergoing the compulsory Computer Training Program to the students belonging to the following based handicapped categories on scrutinizing and conducting assessment/evaluation of the documents submitted in this regard.

- 1. Physically Handicapped Students:
 - permanent physical disability of more than 50% in one limb; or
 - permanent physical disability of more than 60% in two or more limbs.
- Visually Disabled Students :
 - 6/60 to 1/60 or field of vision 110-2;
 - 3/60 to 1/60 or field of vision 100;
 - FC at 1 foot to Nil or field of vision 100;
 - Total absence of sight.

The above said categories shall be regarded as permanent physical/visual disability in order to be eligible for concessions/benefits in granting total exemption from undergoing the Compulsory Computer Training Program.

For availing the aforesaid benefit, such applicants/students will be required to submit a certificate issued by the Medical Superintendent of a State/Central Government Hospital to this effect.

REGISTRATION AND POSTAL TUITION

1. Cancellation of Registration

Registration of students registered upto and including April, 2004 stands terminated on expiry of five-year period on 31st March, 2009 leading to the following immediate consequences:

- (a) Supply of 'Student Company Secretary' bulletin will be discontinued from April, 2009 onwards.
- (b) Response sheets will not be accepted even if submitted and coaching completion certificates will not be issued (after the expiry of registration period)

They are advised to apply for registration de-novo/extension of registration as per the guidelines published in this bulletin.

(Students whose registration is valid upto February, 2009 are, however, eligible to appear in June, 2009 examination without seeking extension of registration/registration de-novo subject to fulfilling other requirements laid down in the regulations framed in this regard.)

2. Change of Address

Change of address, if any, should be intimated to the Institute by sending a separate letter in this regard. While intimating the change in their mailing address, the students are advised to invariably quote the PIN CODE number alongwith the student registration number, name and full postal address with city, state in capital letters.

PIN CODE is required to be mentioned for quick delivery of the mail. Students may, therefore, check up the computerised mailing address as printed on the 'Student Company Secretary' bulletin. In case, it does not carry or carry the wrong PIN CODE number, the same may be intimated immediately quoting student registration number and full postal address with Postal Index Number so that it could be incorporated in the computerised mailing list.

3. E-mail Address of the Students

4. Students Identity Card

All the students appearing in the examination must hold Identity Card in the manner prescribed by the Institute, if not already obtained at the time of seeking registration. For obtaining the Identity Card, students are advised to obtain a proforma from the Headquarters/Regional Offices of the Institute and send it again to the Institute duly filled up and attested as per instructions given in the prospectus/registration letter.

Students who have so far not obtained Identity Cards are advised to write to the Institute immediately. The students should carry their Identity Cards without fail for appearing in the Institute's examination. If the Identity Card already issued has been lost or mutilated, student should send a request for obtaining duplicate Identity Card together with the mutilated Identity Card/Identity Card proforma duly filled in and attested together with Rs. 50/- towards duplicate Identity Card fee.

5. Company Secretaries Examination - June, 2009

I. Examination Fee:

Foundation Course/Programme : Rs. 875 (Lumpsum)
Intermediate/ Executive Programme : Rs. 900 (Per group/

Module)

Final/Professional Programme

: Rs. 750 (Per group/ Module)

Student seeking paperwise exemption for the first time (on qualification basis) are required to remit the exemption fee @ Rs. 100 per subject in addition to the examination fee on or before the last date.

II. Eligibility For Appearing In The Executive Programme Examination:

In terms of regulation 33 of the Company Secretaries Regulations, 1982, students registered upto and including August 2008 are eligible to seek enrolment in appearing both modules of June, 2009 session of CS Executive programme examination subject to qualifying successfully the requirement of **Coaching and Computer Training Programme**. However, the students sought registration to CS Executive Programme up to and including the month of November 2008 eligible for appearing any one Module in June 2009 session (i.e. either in Module – I or Module – II) subject to fulfillment of other as conditions laid down in the regulations.

III. Eligibility For Appearing In The Final/Professional Programme Examination:

In terms of regulation 43 of the Company Secretaries Regulations, 1982, students - who have passed/completed both groups of the Intermediate examination upto and including June , 2008 - are eligible to seek enrolment to appear in all groups/modules and/or in combination thereof in any number of Group(s)/Module(s) in June, 2009 session of completion of Final/ Professional programme examination respectively, subject to completion of coaching and fulfilling the other conditions as laid down in the regulations.

IV. Last Date for Receipt of Enrollment Applications:

The last date for receipt of application to the June 2009 examination, complete in all respects, together with the requisite examination fee in the Institute, is **25th March**, **2009**. However, enrollment applications accompanied with late fee of Rs. 100/-, if received in the institute after the closing date, but on or before **9th April**, **2009** will be entertained.

Students who could not be enrolled in the earlier examination owing to late receipt of enrollment application, cancellation of registration etc. and whose examination fee was kept at credit, are advised to send fresh enrollment applications requesting therein for the adjustment of amount at their credit together with the balance of examination fee, if any. Formal application along with the original letter issued by the Institute showing credit amount, must reach the Institute on or before the closing date as otherwise such students shall not be enrolled for appearing in June, 2009 examination.

No other remittance/letter/query should be clubbed with the enrollment application/examination fee.

6. Compulsory Enrolment for Final/ Professional Course.

Students who have passed/completed both groups of Intermediate Executive Programme examination are advised to seek compulsory enrolment for undergoing coaching for the Final course/ Professional Programme on payment of Rs. 7500/- towards postal tuition fee.

Please note that a student is admitted to the Final/ Professional Programme examination only after a minimum period of nine calendar months has elapsed since his/her passing the Intermediate/ Executive Programme examination and subject to completion of coaching and fulfillment of other requirements.

7. Uniformity in Signatures

It has been observed that some of the enrollment applications / letters received from the students are either unsigned or bear different signatures from time to time.

All the students are, therefore, advised to maintain uniformity in their signatures on all the correspondence with the Institute including students identity card, enrollment application and attendance sheet provided in the examination hall at the time of writing examinations.

8. Clarification Regarding Paperwise Exemption

- (a) The paperwise exemption is granted only on the basis of specific request received in writing from a registered student along with the attested photocopies of marks sheets for all parts of the Degree/examination (on the basis of which the paperwise exemption is sought) and the exemption fee @ Rs. 100/- per paper. It is one time payment and not to be remitted for availing of paper wise exemption in every session of examination during the validity of registration period.
- (b) The application for claiming paperwise exemption must reach the Institute on or before the last date for submission of enrolment application i.e. 25th March and 25th September for June and December examinations respectively and with a late fee of Rs. 100/-, the application can be accepted upto 9th April and 10th October respectively.
- (c) The paperwise exemption once granted holds good during the validity of registration period or passing/completing the examination, whichever is earlier.
- (d) The paperwise exemption is cancelled only on receipt of a specific request in writing from the student concerned on or before the last date for submission of the enrolment application. If any candidate appears in the exempted paper(s) of examination without receiving the written confirmation from the Institute, but by making personal representation, appeal, request, etc., at the Examination Centre at the last moment, his/her appearance in such paper(s) shall automatically be treated as cancelled.
- (e) It may be noted that candidates who apply for grant of paper wise exemption or seek cancellation of paper wise exemption already granted, before the last date of submission of enrolment applications for a particular examination, must see and ensure that they receive written confirmation from the Institute at least 15-20 days prior to the commencement of the examination. Candidates who would presume automatic grant or cancellation of paper wise exemption without obtaining written confirmation on time and absent themselves in any paper(s) of examination and/or appear in the exempted paper(s) would do so at their own risk and responsibility and the matter will be dealt with as per the above guidelines.
- (f) Exemption once cancelled on request in writing shall not be granted again under any circumstances.
- (g) The candidates who have passed either group of the Intermediate/Final examination under the old syllabus, may claim the paperwise exemption in the corresponding subject(s) of new syllabus indicating the basis of exemption as "APO" in the appropriate column of the enrolment application.
- (h) In case the paperwise exemption has already been granted on the basis of qualification or the candidates is eligible for grant of exemption on the basis of securing 60% or more marks, a photocopy of the letter/marks-sheet issued by the Institute should be enclosed with the enrolment application while claiming such exemption, failing which the same may not be granted for the ensuing examination.
- (i) No exemption fee is payable for availing paperwise exemption on the basis of "APO" or on the basis of securing 60% or more marks in the Institute's examination.
- (j) Paperwise exemption fee is payable only when the exemption is to be availed on the basis of qualification(s) specified for the purpose.

9. Exemption from Computer Training

A student can be exempted from undergoing the course on the basis of his existing qualification / degree in the computer field and qualifies the need of 'Course Contents Syllabus' as scheduled by NIIT for C.S. Students, subject to the condition that he or she enrolls himself/ herself for an online exemption test (to be conducted by NIIT) from any of the NIIT Center on all India basis and successfully clears the test.

Note: Students having Passed/ Completed the Intermediate Course on/or before December' 06 session of CS Examination; are – however – not required to comply with the requirements of the Compulsory Computer Training Programme.

10. Completion of Coaching and Filling Up of Examination Forms:

At times gueries are received by the Institute from the students with regard to filling up of examination forms for want of issue of coaching completion certificate. It is clarified that students (i) who are undergoing oral coaching, and (ii) students who have submitted or re-submitted their response sheets and/or would be submitting or re-submitting the response sheets with in the stipulated period, are eligible to fill up the examination forms for the respective session of examination. Such students need not withhold the submission of their examination forms for want of coaching completion certificates. The students concerned are advised to make a note in the application form to the effect that they are undergoing oral coaching/have submitted response sheets and are awaiting coaching completion certificates. Since there cannot be any change with regard to the closing date for submission of examination forms, students need not wait for the issue of coaching completion certificates for filling up their examination forms. They are advised to mention against the appropriate column in the enrolment application form that coaching completion certificates are being awaited.

Students who were issued with limited permission letters, for appearing in December, 2008 examination, are advised to submit the deficient response sheets immediately as such students, if failed, will not be allowed to appear in June, 2009 examination, unless they are issued with the regular coaching completion certificates (s) for the group (s)/ module (s) for which limited permission letter was issued.

Students who secure 35% or more marks in aggregate and 30% marks in individual paper in a group/ module in December, 2008 examination, are advised to submit photocopy of the marks sheet for the issue of Coaching Completion Certificate, if eligible.

Note: Students sought enrolment to CS Professional Programme and wish to write June '09 session of CS Professional Programme examination (New Syllabus); as a special case may submit the response sheets of the relevant Module(s) by 31st March 2009.

- (i) option of Hindi Medium for writing the examination is to be exercised for all papers of an examination OR a particular group of examination, and not for any individual paper(s) in the enrolment application form each time for appearing in the examination:
- option of medium for writing examination once exercised is irrevocable for that particular session of examination;
- (iii) answer books of candidates who write part of papers/answers in one medium and the remaining part in other medium are liable to be cancelled without any notice;

It is further clarified, that once option for Switch over to New Syllabus has been made/exercised, the same cannot be reverted to Old Syllabus in any case, as such please be clear before exercising your option for New Syllabus or Old Syllabus in the examination/enrolment form.

ATTENTION ALL STUDENTS APPEARING IN THE CS INTERMEDIATE (EXECUTIVE PROGRAM) EXAMINATIONS

COMPULSORY COMPUTER TRAINING SCHEME

In the Company Secretaries Regulations, 1982, for regulation 40, the following regulation shall be substituted, as published in the Gazette of India(Extra Ordinary) vide Notification No. ICSI/710/1(M)/1 dated 3rd May, 2006.

"40 Admission to the Intermediaten (Executive Program) Examinations —-

No candidate shall be admitted to the Intermediate (Executive Program) examination unless he/she :-

- (a) is a registered student and produces a certificate from the head of the coaching administration (by whichever name designated) to the effect that he has undergone satisfactorily a course of postal or oral tuition for the Intermediate examination; and
- (b) has successfully completed computer training program as may be specified from time to time by the Council and in the manner so specified or exempted there from;
- (c) applies with such examination fee as may be determined by the council from time to time so as to reach the Secretary, in accordance with the directions given by the Council."

In terms of the aforesaid amendment in the Company Secretaries Regulations, 1982, all students are required to successfully undergo a Compulsory Computer Training Programme for becoming eligible for appearing in the CS Intermediate Examinations from June, 2007 examinations onwards.

The Institute, in compliance of the aforesaid amendments, has tied up with M/s NIIT through which 70 hours of computer training shall be provided to the students/members of the Institute in all Centres of NIIT all over the country. To undergo this course, a student/member has to approach any NIIT Centre on all India basis. To take admission, he/she has to deposit the requisite fees at the respective NIIT Centre and fulfill the formalities as per the requirements of the Computer Training Centre.

The list of NIIT Centres including detailed course contents, module details and topic-wise time duration etc. have been published on the website of the ICSI i.e. www.icsi.edu under FAQ.

Salient features of the course in brief: -

Duration of the Course	70 Hours
Fee	Rs.3000 per participant for General Category & Rs.2500 per participant for SC/ST Category Note: Service Tax as per the GOI rules applicable from time to time shall be paid in actual by the participant

Students having exposure to computer during their education or have undergone similar course, may apply for on-line exemption to NIIT at the nearest center available to them and successfully clears the test.

Students placed at far reaching places and are not having NIIT center nearest to their place may, however, undergo the computer course of at least 3 months duration - with maximum coverage of the ICSI-NIIT course contents - from any computer training Institute and then enroll for on-line exemption test at any of the NIIT Center on all India basis and successfully clears the test.

A fee of Rs. 450 plus Service Tax etc. per student is payable for online exemption test (to be conducted by NIIT) which is applicable for a maximum of TWO attempts within a period of one month.

Note: Students having passed/completed the Intermediate Course on/or before December '06 session of CS Examination; are - however - not required to comply with the requirements of the Compulsory Computer Training program.

The students declared passed in Dec.' 2008 session of Intermediate/Executive Programme examination but have not completed the compulsory computer training, are also required to successfully undergo the computer training for becoming eligible for appearing in the final stage of CS examination.

Guidelines for Switch Over to New Syllabus

GUIDELINES FOR SWITCH OVER TO NEW SYLLABUS

The Council in exercise of the powers vested under clause (a) of Sub-section (2) of section 15 of the Company Secretaries Act, 1980 as amended by the Company Secretaries (Amendment) Act, 2006-has approved the New Syllabus and decided as under:

- The last Foundation Course examination under the existing syllabus as specified in Part-I of Schedule CCB shall be held in June, 2009 and the syllabus specified in the said Part I of Schedule CCB shall crease to operate after the said examination.
- The last Intermediate Examination under the existing syllabus as specified in Part II of Schedule CCB shall be held in December, 2009 and the syllabus specified in the said Part II of Schedule CCB shall cease to operate after the said examination.
- The last Final Examination under the existing syllabus as specified in Part III of Schedule CCB shall be held in December 2010 and the syllabus specified in the said Part III of Schedule CCB shall cease to operate after the said examination.
- 4. All students who are not able to complete the Foundation/ Intermediate/Final Examination under the existing syllabus as specified in Part-I, Part- II and Part-III of Schedule CCB shall compulsorily be required to appear under the New Syllabus effective from December 2009, June 2010 and June 2011 sessions of CS Examination(s) respectively.

They shall, however, be required to undergo and complete coaching in the remaining subjects in order to become eligible to appear in a particular module under the New Syllabus. Due credit for the response sheets already submitted under the Old Syllabus for any subject shall be available where there is a corresponding subject under the New Syllabus. Such students are required to submit response sheets for the remaining subjects under the New Syllabus. Students having successfully completed the coaching for any particular group(s) under the Old Syllabus; shall be deemed to have completed the coaching for the respective module(s) under the New Syllabus.
- 9. While purchase of Study Materials under the New Syllabus is not compulsory on the part of the students who switechover to the New Syllabus those students who require the same may obtain it by remitting Rs. 120/- per study material by hand and Rs. 160 per study material by post by way of Demand Draft drawn in favour of the institute of Company Secretaries of India, payable at New Delhi
- Please note that once a candidate has been switched over to the New Syllabus, he/she shall not be allowed to revert to the Old Syllabus under any circumstances.

CLARIFICATION REGARDING HINDI MEDIUM

Queries are often being received by the Institute with regard to the option of medium for pursuing the Company Secretaryship Course.

It is clarified that the students may opt for pursuing the course in English/Hindi medium. However, the study material at present is available in English medium only. In any case, the students can enjoy the facility of submitting their response sheets to the test papers under the Postal Tuition Scheme in English or Hindi medium. Similarly, they can opt to write the Institute's main examination in English or Hindi Medium.

As regards writing of examination, the option is to be exercised while filling up the examination form as and when the students intend to appear in the examination. This option is to be exercised on group wise basis and not on individual paperwise basis. Answering to test papers and writing examination partly in English and partly in Hindi medium is not permissible.


