When Narayan filed a complaint with the Consumer Disputes Redressal Forum, the railways contended that the redressal forum under the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 had no jurisdiction to consider a complaint of this nature in view of section 15 of the Railway Claims Tribunal Act, 1987 read with section 13 of the said Act. Will Narayan succeed? Give reasons in support of your answer.

- (ix) Powers and duties of the Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC).

- (b) Attempt **any five** of the following stating relevant legal provisions and decided case law, if any:
 - An employee retired on reaching the age of superannuation. However, the employer withheld his gratuity on the ground that certain criminal proceedings, which had commenced prior to his retirement, against him for causing misappropriation of substantial cash were still continuing. Is the action of management justified?
 - (ii) The workers of Manya Engineering Works gheraoed their personnel manager to compel him to accept their demands. When the management took disciplinary action against them, they went to the court and claimed immunity under the Trade Unions Act, 1926. Will they succeed?
 - (iii) An employee was terminated, but subsequently reinstated with full back wages. However, the management did not pay him bonus. Is the employee entitled to claim bonus under the provisions of the Payment of Bonus Act, 1965?
 - (iv) During the pendency of a proceeding before a tribunal, the employer wants to make certain changes in the conditions of service of workmen. The said modifications, however, were not in respect of any matter connected with the dispute pending before the tribunal. Will the employer be able to effect such changes in the conditions of service of workmen?
 - (v) An industrial establishment engaged an employee to assist in one or the other operational work incidental to its main industrial operation. However, the employer denied such an employee the status of a workman on the ground that his work was not directly connected with the main operation of the industrial establishment. Can the management do so ?
 - (vi) The management of a Tea Estate terminated the services of a technician on the ground of incompetence. Later on, the cause was espoused by the workers' union who raised an industrial dispute. The management of Tea Estate contended that the employee was not a member of the workers' union and that there could not be an industrial dispute in this case. Will the management succeed in its stand?
 - (vii) The Municipal Board entrusted electrification work of a town to the State employees. A workman was injured while performing his work. Who will be liable to pay compensation the Municipal Board or the State? Why?
