Deployment and usage of Change Request Form (CRF) on MCA-21 (February 19, 2024)

Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) vide issuing general circular no. 02/2024 dated February 19, 2024, has informed its stakeholders that Change Request Form (CRF) has been made available on V3 portal for the convenience of users of MCA-21 services. This web-based Form is to be used under exceptional circumstances, for making a request to Registrar of Companies (RoCs), for the purposes which cannot be catered through any existing form or services or functionality available either at Front Office level (users of MCA-21 services) or Back Office level (RoCs).

The Form should be processed by RoCs within 03 days of its filing, after which it should be forwarded to Joint Director (e-governance cell), who shall process and decide the matter within a maximum time of 07 days.

Reliance Life Insurance Company Ltd. & Anr. {Appellant(s)} Vs. Jaya Wadhwani {Respondent(s)}

Supreme Court of India Arising out of SLP(Civil) No.10954 of 2019 & Arising out of SLP(Civil) No.15588 of 2021

Brief Facts:

The sole question involved in these appeals is as to what would be the date from which the insurance policy becomes effective; whether it would be the date on which the policy is issued or the date of the commencement mentioned in the policy or it would be the date of the issuance of the deposit receipt or cover note. The District Consumer Disputes Redressal Forum, the State Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission and the National Commission have proceeded on the basis that the date of issuance of the initial deposit receipt of premium is the date of commencement of the Policy.

Judgement:

The Hon'ble Apex Court relying upon the judgment in the case of *Life Insurance* Corporation of India and Another vs. Dharam Vir Anand (1998) 7 SCC 348, and in the case of Life Insurance Corpn. of India vs. Mani Ram (2005) 6 SCC 274, reiterated the same view and held that the date of issue of policy would be the relevant date even if there was backdating as has been done in the case of *Dharam Vir Anand*.

Hon'ble Supreme Court held that in the present appeals, we do not find any such issue of back dating but the date of issuance of the policy would be the relevant date for all the purposes and not the date of proposal or the date of issuance of the receipt. In view of the above, the stand taken by the appellant is approved. The impugned orders are thus liable to be set aside.
