# Russia and Ukrainian Conflict - Its Genesis and Impact on India\*

#### Introduction

The current conflict between Russia and Ukraine has its genesis in 1990, when anti-communist protests engulfed central and Eastern Europe whose spark ignited in Poland and gradually became a fire and spreaded throughout the Soviet bloc. In Ukraine, January 1990 witnessed more than 400,000 people joining hands in a human chain stretching some 400 miles from the western city of Ivano-Frankivsk to Kyiv, the capital, in the north-central part of Ukraine. Many wave the blue and yellow Ukrainian flag that had been banned under Soviet rule.

Following an unsuccessful coup in Moscow, the Ukrainian parliament declares independence a second time on Aug. 24, a date that is still celebrated as Ukraine's official Independence Day. Coming to the present scenario,

Years	Events	
1991	Leonid Kravchuk, leader of the Soviet republic of Ukraine, declares independence from Moscow. In a referendum and presidential election, Ukrainians approved independence and elected Kravchuk as president.	
1994	Leonid Kuchma defeated Kravchuk in a presidential election which was deemed largely free and fair by the observers.	
1999	Kuchma was re-elected in 1999 in a vote riddled with irregularities.	
2004	Pro-Russian candidate Viktor Yanukovich was declared president but allegations of vote-rigging triggered protests which came to be known as the Orange Revolution, forcing a re-run of the vote. A pro-Western former prime minister, Viktor Yushchenko, was elected president.

2005	Yushchenko took power with promises to lead Ukraine out of the Kremlin's orbit, towards NATO and the EU. He appointed former energy company boss Yulia Tymoshenko as prime minister but, after infighting in the pro-Western camp, she was sacked.		
2008	NATO promised Ukraine it will one day join the alliance.		
2010	Yanukovich defeated Tymoshenko in a presidential election. Russia and Ukraine clinched a gas pricing deal in exchange for extending the lease for the Russian navy in a Ukrainian Black Sea port.		
2013	Yanukovich's government suspended trade and association talks with the EU in November and opted to revive economic ties with Moscow, triggering months of mass rallies in Kyiv.		
2014	There was a protest largely focused around Kyiv's Maidan square that turned violent. Dozens of protesters were killed. In February, parliament voted to remove Yanukovich, who fled. Within days, armed men seized parliament in the Ukrainian region of Crimea and raised the Russian flag. Moscow annexed the territory after a March 16 referendum which received overwhelming support in Crimea for joining the Russian Federation.		
	In April, pro-Russian separatists in the eastern region of Donbass declared independence. Fighting broke out which continued sporadically, despite frequent ceasefires, in 2022.		
	In May, businessman Petro Poroshenko won a presidential election with a pro- Western agenda.		
	In July, a missile brought down passenger plane MH17 en route from Amsterdam to Kuala Lumpur, killing all 298 people on board. The weapon used was traced back by investigators to Russia, which denied involvement.		
2017	An association agreement between Ukraine and the EU opens markets for free trade of goods and services, and visa-free travel to the EU for Ukrainians.		
2019	A new Ukrainian Orthodox church won formal recognition, angering the Kremlin.		
	• Former comic actor Volodymyr Zelenskiy defeated Poroshenko in an April presidential election on promises to tackle corruption and end the war in eastern Ukraine. His Servant of the People party won a July parliamentary election.		
	U.S. President Donald Trump asked Zelenskiy in July to investigate Joe Biden, his rival in the U.S. presidential race, and Biden's son Hunter over possible business dealings in Ukraine. The call resulted into a failed attempt to impeach Trump.

- **Feb 4 -** Putin, at Beijing Winter Olympics, won Chinese support for his demand that Ukraine not be allowed to join NATO.
- **Feb 7 -** French President Emmanuel Macron saw some hope for a diplomatic resolution of the crisis after meeting Putin in the Kremlin. Macron then visits Kyiv and praises the "sang-froid" of Zelenskiy and the

Ukrainian people.

- **Feb 9 -** Biden said "things could go crazy quickly" as the U.S. State Department advises Americans in Ukraine to leave immediately. Other countries also urge their nationals to leave.
- **Feb 14 -** Zelenskiy urged Ukrainians to fly flags and sing the national anthem in unison on Feb. 16, a date some Western media say Russia could invade.
- **Feb 15** Russia said some of its troops are returning to base after exercises near Ukraine and mocks Western warnings about a looming invasion. Russia's parliament asks Putin to recognise as independent two Russian-backed breakaway regions in eastern Ukraine.
- **Feb 18 -** U.S. ambassador to the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe Michael Carpenter said Russia has probably deployed between 169,000-190,000 personnel in and near Ukraine.
- Feb 19 Russia's strategic nuclear forces hold exercises overseen by Putin.
- **Feb 21 -** France's Macron said Biden and Putin have agreed in principle to a summit over Ukraine.
- **Feb 21 -** Putin signed a decree recognising two breakaway regions in eastern Ukraine as independent entities.

#### **Impact on India**

In a country where an average household spends two-thirds of the daily income on buying a vegetarian meal, rising prices of key ingredients following Russia's invasion of Ukraine will make Indians feel the pinch. This may result into people having little left to spend on other essential items like health and education.

Most people in India depend on agriculture for their livelihood and hence, food availability is not a big problem. However, affordability still is. The Russia-Ukraine war and the consequent supply chain disruptions have only aggravated this concern in India.

Sanctions on Russia, one of the world's largest wheat and sunflower oil producers, have led to a spike in wheat and edible oil prices in India as well. These are the two components that form the heart of an Indian platter. Besides, Russia is also the world's third-largest crude oil producer, and the ongoing sanctions on the country have sent strong headwinds into the global oil market. Brent crude is trading almost consistently above USD 100 a barrel. The subsequent price rise in the retail market is also taking place.

It is to be noted that prices of wheat, mustard, barley, cotton and soybean are up by 14 per cent, 30 per cent, 76 per cent, 61 per cent and 36 per cent. Further, it is believed that Rabi crops like wheat will give an incremental profit of Rs 30,200 crore and major crops Rs 57,800 crore, an increase of 32 per cent year-on-year basis. India's direct trade exposure to Russia, Ukraine and Belarus is merely 1% of total exports and 2.1% of total imports, but its reliance on supply of specific products is much higher. Please refer exhibit 2 for India's trade exposure to Russia and Ukraine.

Thus, it can be observed from the above mentioned exhibit that India has big exposure to both the countries engaged in war, i.e., Russia and Ukraine. The exposure to the project goods is highest, followed by edible oils, fertilisers and so on and so forth. Now if the war persist for long then India might have to witness shortages in supply of these goods thereby exerting a debilitating impact on supply of oil, production of significant goods and services etc.

Coming to the economic growth of India, in 2022 it was estimated that Indian economy will grow at 6.7 percent, but UNCTAD (United Nations Conference on Trade and Development) has reduced it to 4.6 percent. As mentioned above, India may face tough situations on numerous fronts including energy access and prices, trade on primary commodities, repercussions due to trade sanctions, food inflation, tighter policies and financial instability.

According to Reserve Bank of India (RBI), the estimated Real GDP growth for FY 2023 is 7.8%, if the prices of oil is at \$100 / barrel and \$125 / barrel then estimated Real GDP growth is 7.1% and 6.5% respectively.

#### Conclusion

There is a silver lining too i.e., Russia Ukraine war has created opportunities for Indian Agriculture by disrupting global Agri commodity chain due to supply disruptions and that augurs well for the rural economy. Ukraine is amongst largest global exporters of wheat, sunflower,

barley, rapeseed and maize with share of 10 per cent, 47 per cent, 17 per cent, 20 per cent and 14 per cent of global exports. Russia also has strong presence with global exports of 25 per cent, 18 per cent and 14 per cent in sunflower, wheat and barley.

According to the International Monetary Fund, the efficient macroeconomic management of the Covid-19 pandemic has resulted in a strong recovery of India's economy because of which the country is in a better position to face the economic fallout of the current Ukrainian crisis.

Observing that India represents about seven per cent of the total world economy in purchasing power parity (PPP) terms and is one of the countries that are growing rapidly, IMF's Mission Chief for India Nada Choueiri said that India's growth is lifting the global economy and is very important for a well-functioning global economy.

Thus, the ongoing crisis between Russia and Ukraine has shook almost the whole world and India being a major trade partner of Russia is also experiencing its negative impact but as mentioned above, despite crisis, there are opportunities too. Further, being an emerging economy of the globe, India will definitely withstand this tough situation and will continue to grow at a fast pace.



#### Attention Students!!

Temporary Relaxation for complying with the requirement of Pre-Examination Test and One Day Orientation Programme for enrollment to June, 2022 session of CS Examinations

As per the guidelines, for enrollment to June, 2022 Session of CS Examinations, the students are required to comply with the following requirements:

- a) Pre-Examination Test (Applicable for students of Executive and Professional Programme under 2017 New Syllabus)
- b) One Day Orientation Programme (ODOP) (Applicable for students of Foundation and Executive Programme registered on or after 1st June, 2019)

As a special case, temporary relaxation is being extended to the students, to enable them to enroll for June, 2022 Session of CS Examinations upto 25th March, 2022 (without Late Fees) and upto 9th April 2022 (with Late Fees) without checking the status of compliance with the aforesaid requirements. Such relaxation is being allowed subject to the condition that the students shall comply with the requirements of Pre-exam Test & ODOP by 16:00 Hours, on 30th April 2022.

In case the students, enroll for the June, 2022 Examinations by availing temporary relaxation, are not able to clear the Pre-exam test & ODOP by the stipulated date as mentioned above, Admit Cards of such students for June 2022 Examination shall NOT be issued and the Examination Fee remitted by them shall be carry forward for the next session i.e., for December 2022 Session of Examination.

This relaxation shall only be applicable for June, 2022 session without creating any precedent for future.

#### REGISTRATION

#### 1. VALIDITY OF CS FOUNDATION PROGRAMME ADMISSION

Foundation Programme Registration is normally valid for a period of three years from the date of registration or till student passes the CS Foundation Programme examination of the Institute whichever is earlier subject to the Regulation of the Institute, as in force from time to time. Further, New Admissions to the Foundation Programme of CS Course stands discontinued from 3<sup>rd</sup> February 2020.

(Note: Existing Foundation Programme Students shall be allowed to appear in the Foundation Programme Examinations till expiry of the validity of their registrations. Such students, after passing the Foundation Programme Examinations, may register for Executive Programme as per existing process.)

#### 2. REGISTRATION FOR CS EXECUTIVE PROGRAMME

In order to become eligible for registration as a student of Executive Programme, an applicant, who is an Indian National, shall apply in the appropriate form, along with the student registration fee, annual subscription, if applicable, education fee and such other fees, as may be determined by the Council and shall also produce proof to the satisfaction of the Council that he,-

- (i) has passed Senior Secondary Examination (10+2 system) conducted by an examining body constituted by law in India or an examination recognised by the Central Government or State Government or equivalent thereto for the purposes of admission to Bachelor's degree course and has complied with such requirements as may be determined by the Council; and
- has passed Company Secretary Executive Entrance Test (CSEET) conducted by (ii) the Institute in such manner, mode and eligibility as may be determined by the Council or any other test or examination recognised or equivalent thereto or exempted therefrom by the Council:

Provided that from the date of the introduction of the Company Secretary Executive Entrance Test under these regulations, all the students of Foundation Programme having valid registrations immediately before the date of introduction of the Company Secretary Executive Entrance Test, may be given such relaxation for number of attempts in the Foundation Programme Examination or allowed to appear in the Company Secretary Executive Entrance Test as may be determined by the Council:

Provided further that the number of attempt or relaxation in the Foundation Programme Examination shall in no case be beyond the date of expiry of his registration.

CS Executive Entrance Test (CSEET) is being introduced which will be a mandatory qualifying test for all categories of students for registration to Executive Programme except a few exempted categories.

The following categories of students shall be exempted from qualifying CSEET and can seek registration directly to Executive Programme:

- CS Foundation Programme passed students Exemption Fee Nil a)
- b) ICAI (The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India) Final Course passed students- Exemption Fee: Rs. 5000/-

- c) ICMAI (The Institute of Cost Accountants of India) Final Course passed students -Exemption Fee: Rs. 5000/
- d) Graduates with 50% marks and Post Graduates- Exemption Fee: Rs. 5000/



#### 2. STUDENT IDENTITY CARD

Identity Card can be downloaded after logging into the Student Portal at www.icsi.edu. After downloading the Identity card, students are compulsorily required to get it attested by any of the following authorities with his/her seal carrying name, professional membership No., designation and complete official address:

- Member of the Institute, with ACS/FCS No.
- 2. Gazetted Officer of the Central or State Government.
- 3. Manager of a Nationalized Bank.
- 4. Principal of a recognized School/College.
- 5. Officer of ICSI.

Unattested Identity Cards are not valid and the students are advised to carry duly attested Identity Card for various services during their visits to the offices of the Institute. Examination Centres, etc.

#### 3. DEDUCTION OF 30% OF THE TOTAL FEE REMITTED BY THE APPLICANT IN RESPECT OF REGISTRATIONS LYING PENDING FOR MORE THAN A YEAR

The Institute has decided to reject the applications of such students who do not submit the documents within one year after their registration in Foundation and Executive programme by deducting 30% of the fee remitted by them towards administrative charges after expiry of one year. Therefore it is advised that all such students may complete all formalities to approve the registration in the stipulated time period failing which their registration applications would be rejected.

#### 1. **CHARTERED SECRETARY JOURNAL**
